



The floor is only preserved out to EU I because it has a steady base formed by the back wall in the first phase of construction. There is no clear edge to the floors so it is hard to say what happened with them.

In the southern half of EUH and all of EUI we see two different floor levels. At the SW corner of EUH, the first floor is 35 cm BGS and consists of large, uneven rocks. Cleaning at the end of the day Saturday revealed a stone floor in EU J. The profile suggests it may have actually been two or more courses high possibly a low terrace. This was not revealed in other excavations. The construction style resembles that of the floor and back vall in the earliest phase of construction-medium sized rocks, well placed, with large rocks forming the odges of the floor. It extends from the northern edge of EU K and will be followed in towards the wall in EU H. It is at 130 cm BGS in EUK and 150 cm BGS in EU J

We are expanding from EUH to the west. We only laid out two to see how the wall looks here and if the orientestion changes at all.



Vimberto Cleared away some dirt on the west wall of EU G to reveal either more of the wall present in EU E +F or another door jamb that was connected. It oppears now that what I originally thought was a door jamb on the northern side of the summit is a wall-extended from this door jamb to the south.

In EUN there was a rock that lined up north/south with the door jamb. This rock continued the line out beyond Back would I. It was either associated with the last phase of construction or the one right before that. It seems to continue westward through EUN + O with at least three other large rocks in the line.

Farther to the south this wail continues about 150 cm. Afthe orner where EUN and EUI meet there is a rock that appears to have been sculpted.

Ellen says it was natural but probably selected for this unique feature.



First there was the floor on the summit. A door jamb - the same as those discovered in earlier excavations was built cm from the southern edge of the platform. This platform had an ledge and then dropped down to the stone floor. In the second phase they filled up to the top of the door jam's going north on the same floor. To the south they extended the floor, covering the back wall - it is undear if this wall dropped down in one wall or if there was a terrace here. On top of the previous back wall, to the south of the door jains, there may have been an open space between a more sothern wall and the jumb that was later filled in with the material found in EU N. But, there is also a very large root that runs through this space that might have caused the rocks to fall like threy did.

The thick layer of jumbled rocks we are finding in EU T, U, AA & AB .5 not present on the other side of west wall 3 in EU N, O + Q.
