First day out in the field - it rained in the morning, but hopefully now that the ciampa is up it will stop!

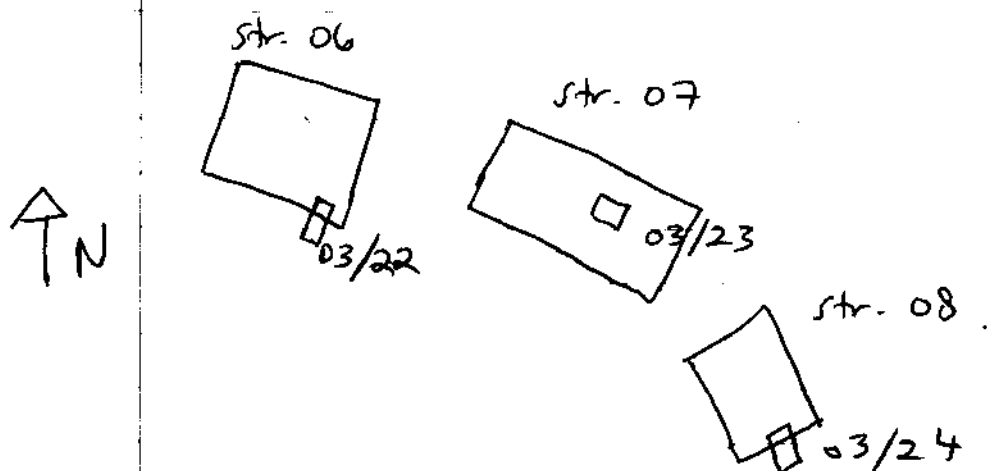
The site is the same as last year - lots of guava trees, but no sign of the cows yet.

The site is being cleaned, and fences are being set up now. My excavation units are as follows:

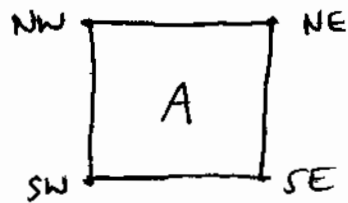
