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P-84-17-1 site 300 - south of La Cebita This site consists of 3 large mounds and some, the exact number still unknown until the land is cleared, smaller mounds. It is located in the Tencoa Valley on the land of Manuel Baide. Today we surveyed the 2 large mounds noted on the following sketch. This area consists of 2 large mounds (Strs1 & 7)structure one is 5 sided, with a staircase and a terrace. Atop Str. 1 are 5 small structures (Strs 2-6). Structure 7 13 5 sided with 2 possible terraces, and a stairease. Hop it are 4 small structures (Strs 8-11). To the East of these mounds is a possible stone wall (str.#12) a barbed wire lence and a platane field. To the West is a barbed wire fence and a modern road. To build this road part of Str.# 1 was cut off. To the South there is the appearage A quacate a perennial water source. The site itself is cut by the road that runs between Star Barbara, and Taillabe to the north of this road is the third large mouher which has yet to be cleared and surveyed. The land itself is being used currently as grazing land and platano fields—these don't seem to be very healthy this year probably as said by Sr. baide, due to the bad weather (too dry now too wet). The soil is dark and seems to be tertile. The mounds themselves seem to be well preserved-no signs of any looting in the 2 mounds surveyed today. As well no sign of pot sherds was found only lines of stones. As for local resources of stones there is the cobbles of the Quebraia which is very close and the hills surrounding the town of La Ceibita, again very close. The mounds stem to be organized in a line, The 2 surveyed (187) seem to be connected by a natural




SITE #301 awned by Remijio Diaz Sketch wap: tmot West to Hie Ulua Quebrada Aguacate

Located South of la Cebita across the road to the west from site #300. It consisted of 6 structures, only one with any kind of elevation. These structures are arranged in a line parallel to that of the mounds of site #300. The east side of str. #1 is at a lower elevation than the west side. This marked the natural change of elevation in the field. It is a field of good size, relatively flat and cleared. Probably it is used as grazing land but no animals were seen using if It is owned by a Remijio Draiz of San Vicente. The constructions are made, of river cobbles. To the


Location of sites south from la Ceibita to the E-W Road to Gl Wispero.






It is located south and slightly last of site #304, on the west side of the Sta. Barbara / Jaulabe road and north of the El Nispero road by two fulds. It is currently being used as pasture but it is alternately cultivoted. The field itself rises slowly from north to south and from east to west so that the SW corner is higher than any other part of the field. On this rise was found the cobble scatter and the cultural material. Under the mango tree is a large, pile of cobbles - probably spiled up there in the process of clearing the field for agriculture. One handle fragment was found: again the nearest, perennial water source is the quebrada aquacite The rest of the fields to the south border the el Mispero Road. These fields belong to the mayor of the Barbara, Ramon Mejia. In the field at the NW functure of the Sta Barbara Daulabé and the Nispero Road We found a few cobble concentrations We didn't have time today to man these. These will be site #306 when we return. all the fields on the west side of the main road from the northern limit of the valley to the EW El Mispero road and west only 2-3 fields, not all the way to the Ulua. Evidence throughout the area of textensive damage to sites from agricultural practises was found. No significantly were located and very few sherds, lithic material etc. wasfound.

of cophles as is the hillsides surrounding la Ceibita. The site itself is located directly across the Quebracla from site #300. It is situated up on a natural rise between the guebrada and a modern stone wall. It consists of 44 6 mounds (areas of the field have yet to be cleared, 4 mounds have been cleared as of today.) One is a long narrow mound topped by 2 small structure. One is a larger mound topped by 2 *L-shaped structures. The fourth is again a long narrow mound topped with 2 small structures. These structures are much arranged in a line as in sites#300 and #301 but the small structure out of alignment.




These fields are currently being used as grazing pastures and are crossed with modern drainage ditches, some dry some not. The nearest water source is the Maignal but it is possible that there are underground water sources close to the surface This can be seen in that #308 was very swampy even in areas not next to the drainage ditches. This as well is true in the other 2 fields. Perhaps this water comes from these drainage ditches which have their source at the Maigual. A source for cobbles is again the quebradas, most likely Maignal, and the hillsides surrounding the valley. In #307-309 were found 14 structures, all relatively small and rectangular. There seems to beligaterning in the layout of these structures. The talkst of these structures was about Im The landowner of all three fields is Ramon Mejia, the wayor of Sta. Barbara. The site organization itself is not decided by the fences but instead by the drainage distches as #308 Str 1 is cut by the fonce and #308 Str 4 is on the Eside of it from the rest of the site.



Site #310 is located in the 2nd field on the Sta Barbara/Taulabse road past the San Vicente Road and in the field one & west from it. It's neavest perennial water source is the Margual evelorada but there is a seasonal quebrada to the SW that is closer. Cobble resources are the quebradas and the hellsides nearby in all directions. This site consists of 8 structures '6 of which have slight elevation, one of which is a line of stones. There seems to be no patterning to the

Thursday, June 14
Today because of the rain we got to the field late. We remapped site #306 and mapped site #312. In site #312 were found 11 structures, the largest-Str 9-being about a meter in elevation.



All of these structures have elevation but there seems, at this point, that there is not a pattern to them. The nearest source of water is the quebrada Margual, a perennial quebrada, but there is a seasonal quebrada closer to the 5W.

This site is in 2 fields along the side road veering to the SW from the Sta Barbara/Taulabé toad.

Site 315 is located to the south of 314, to the east of
316 and to the west of the side road which veers from
the Sta Barbara / Daulabé road. Along the south side just
before the varted wire fence is a drainage / irrigation
ditch. It is currently fallow field at the west end,
cornfield at the last end. The landowner is
Paco Gernander. This the site consists of one structure
a large rectangular structure about a meter and
1/2 in height.



This structure may be a church with the altar on the east side but this is not certain. Some colonial sherds were found here. As well some piles of copplex were found here but their source

Gualsognito Site#125 Landowner=

This site consists of 4 small vectorigular structures with no elevation. On the south it borders a small field which borders the new road (see sketch map). It is a fallow field with signs that it was recently used for grazing. It is crossed to by a small creekbed which now has water. This is most likely a seasonal creekbed. The structures themselves are located near the fence (south) and at the base of a large steep natural rise. This rise is covered with it scattered cobbles croded from the hillside. They, the structures, are patterened in a strought line, not around any sort of plaza. The warest perennal water source is perhaps the Ulua which is 200m to the south.



Tencoa site 327 Landowner-?
