PSB 36/6-3	This is a rim fragment of a scored corner lid. The paste is crude (almost very crude) with lots of large inclusions up to the size of small pebbles. These are of white, black, mica and some red and are visible on both surfaces. Despite its roughness due to the inclusions on the surface and the fact that it is very worn both surfaces look like they were at one time smoothed. The scored surface bands back gently to the rim. The scoring that is visible is very shallow + narrow and hard to see. Again this is partly due to the worn condition of the spher. This also makes it hard to get an overall idea of design. The non scored, rather than the scored side looks to be the one burnt by use.	6 6

This is a rim fragment of a scored corner lid. The paste is crude (almost very crude) with lots of large inclusions up to the size of small pebbles.
