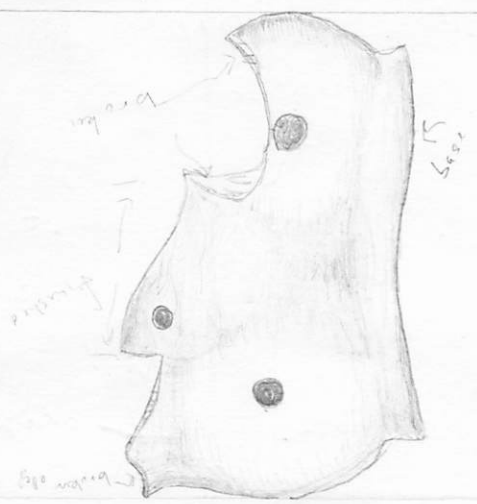

This object does not conform to our usual candeleros, but is close enough to be included as one; otherwise it must be considered an enigmatic object. It consists of two rounded chambers--like small pans--apparently necked, but the tops of both are broken. Each chamber has a pierced hole on either side. The chambers are connected ^{at the top} ~~with~~ by a solid bridge, also pierced ^{which has a lower neck opening between the chambers}. Chambers rest on a rectangular base. The ~~clay~~ ^{clay} medium to fine texture, with large quantities of inclusions, mostly sand, with mica and black particles. The object is crudely made--the base is not flat, the bridge is irregular, the surface is bumpy and unsmoothed. Color 10YR 5/2.5. The item is "grazed", and has a large firing chond on one side, but the chambers are not burnt.

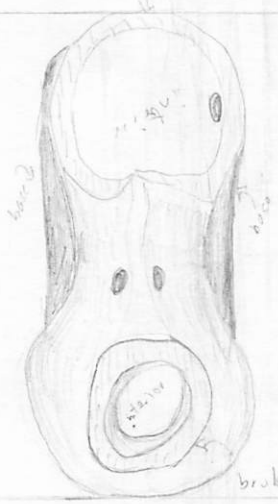

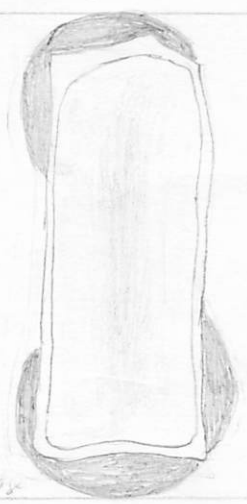
