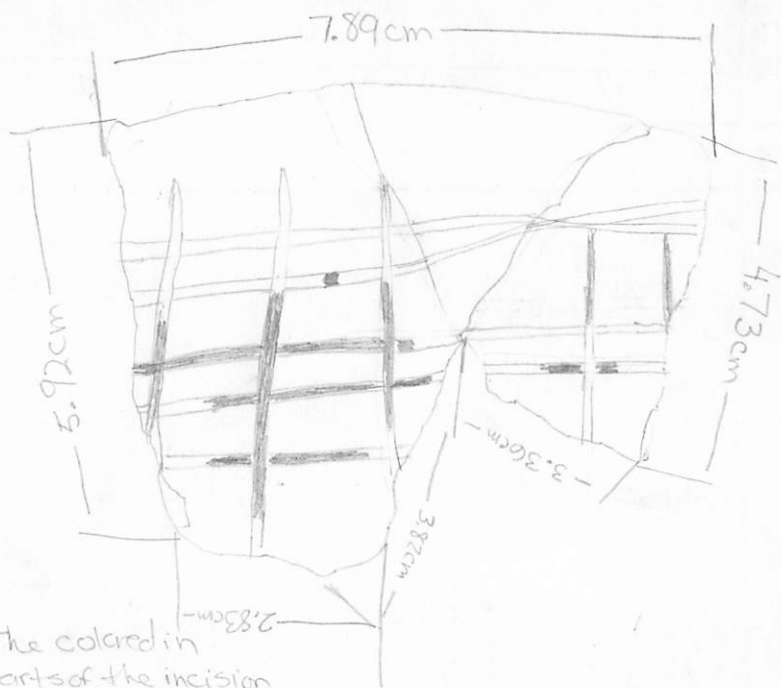

PSB 3G/26-2a-c rim diam 24cm Incision/width 0.2-0.3cm depth 0.1cm dist between 0.5-1.5cm Thickness min 1.29cm max 1.39cm	<p>This is three rim fragments of a scored censer lid which fit together. The paste is fine to medium fine with a fair number of small inclusions of white, shiny, red + brown particles, extending in from the scored surface, which is burnt, about 1/3 of the paste is burnt. The unscored side has been fairly well smoothed and has remnants of a band of red paint a bit in from the rim + paralleling it. The incised side also looks like it was smoothed somewhat before being incised. The incision is narrow and not very deep. It looks like it was made by a single sharp pointed instrument. There seem to be burnt deposits of some sort in some of the incision lines.
