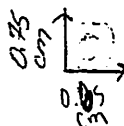

PSB 10G/61-1	Stone Bead - Found in the mandible region of the adult burial 10G/61. It is made of the same type of greenstone as PSB 10G/49-1 (infant's bead) but is lighter in color, given a larger number of crystals in the stone. A bi-conical drill was used to bore the hole. This stone may be actinolite but its exact classification is unknown. Measurements length 3.25cm. thickness 0.65-0.75cm	AEC	AEC

Measurements: Go-Go - bigonial breadth - 10.36cm RB' - minimum ramus breadth - right side - 2.92cm left side - not possible CrH - Coronoid height - right side - 5.89cm left side - not possible measurement descriptions from Brothwell (1969) pp 82-84	SS + WA
