The roughly incised angel is depicted in a relaxed standing position with wings folded down the length of the fragment. His head is turned toward the viewer's left, being seen in profile.

The fragment is a rough rectangle, but with the lower left-hand portion missing.

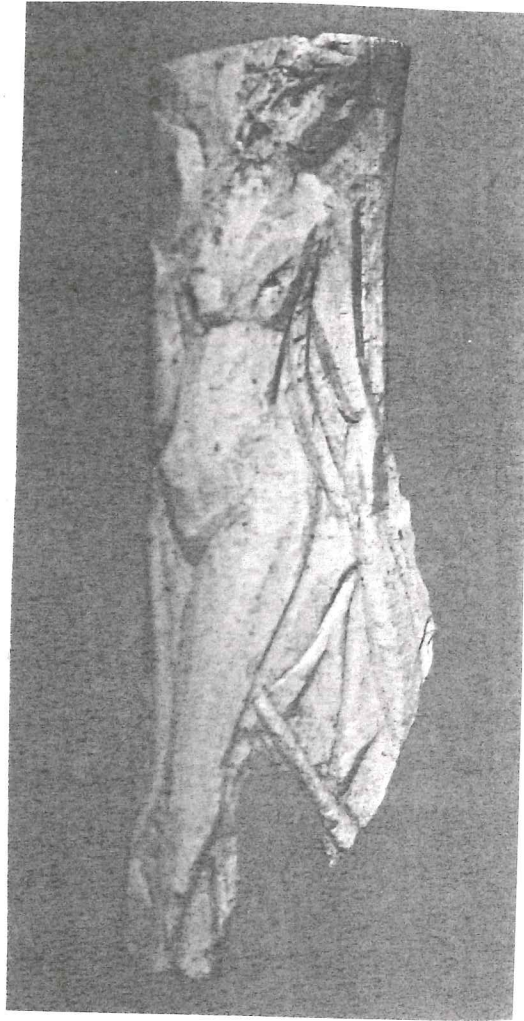
