FOUR BYZANTINE LEAD SEALS

The large seal at the far left shows, on one side, a saint holding a cross; the accompanying inscription appears to invoke his aid. The text on the reverse side contains the title Eparchon, presumably referring to the official issuing the seal.

The other three seals all contain cruciform monograms; the second from the left has a text on its reverse side, while the other two seals have monograms on both sides.

Diameter of largest seal: Approx. 1 1/8" Ca. 7th c.

The set was purchased from Tetragon, London, on October 22, 1994, for \$454.
