Byzantine Bronze Magic Amulet

The heavily worn oval pendant displays, on one side, a nimbed rider spearing a prostrate person (or possibly animal). A now-indecipherable inscription borders the amulet, terminating with a cross on either side of the suspension hole. The other side of the amulet shows a standing nimbed figure with a vertical inscription alongside it which apparently contains the name *Thekla*. A bordering inscription seemingly invokes aid for the bearer of the amulet (*ΦΟΡΟΝΤΙ*), this inscription also ending in a cross.
