ARCHAIC GREEK BRONZE HEAD

This shallow bronze representation of a male face was apparently a decoration on a larger piece, though no means of attachment is now discernible in the hollow at the back. The head is adorned with a double row of curls; the nose is in high relief; the eyes, including pupils, and eyebrows are indicated with incised lines; a long, drooping moustache seems to be depicted with similar incised lines; the long, narrow mouth is comprised of an incised upper lip and a raised lower lip.

The face has a glossy green patina except where it has been worn off on the prominent nose.

The piece is said to have come from Thessaly, Greece.
